- 2. Start/Introductions: The meeting was called to order at 10:05 am.
- 3. Review Current Budget:
 - a. \$25,000 to spend this year. \$4,000 is rolled over from 2021.
 - b. Earmarked:
 - i. \$3,000 to print the maps.
 - ii. \$1,000 map back creative/layout.
 - iii. \$2,500 for website integration of map.
 - c. Budget:
 - i. \$5,000 Event Sponsorships
 - ii. \$10,000 Oroville Marketing
 - iii. \$10,000 Oroville Branding Campaign

4. Event Sponsorships:

- a. Wild & Scenic Film Festival: Shannon presented on the WIld & Scenic Film Festival request for sponsorship. The film festival has had a great turn out the last two years in Oroville. The movie's total cost is \$1,350. Sponsorships would go towards advertising costs and any extra funding goes to the Classrooms on the River program. Organizations who sponsor are featured on the flyer and marketing materials. The film will show on May 21 at the Oroville State Theatre.
- b. It was motioned and seconded (Bruce/Aaron) to sponsor the Wild & Scenic Film Festival for \$500. It was passed unanimously.

6. City of Oroville Marketing RFP

- a. The RFP had one response from the company NorthStar who worked previously with the City of Bakersfield. The company made a presentation to the Oroville City Council on April 19. The plan is for this marketing campaign to connect with other current Oroville marketing campaigns.
- b. The overall budget for the RFP is \$300,000.
- c. It was recommended that the committee earmarks \$10,000 of zoning funds for this marketing campaign once a plan is put together from NorthStar. The committee could add more funds in future years.

7. Advertising Campaign

- a. The group discussed potential uses for the Advertising Campaign funds.
 - i. Joan will look into QR campaign ideas.
 - ii. Video & Photography assets for events like the DBA's First Fridays, Community Tree Lighting, Farm to Table, and other community events.
 - iii. Fund an event coordinator for community events.
