

dwell Park is full of fun and adventure! Help eep the park safe & beautiful. Please be familiar ith the following important information.

Bidwell Park is open to the public from 5 AM to 11PM daily unless otherwise posted. Vehicle access varies based on season, location, and wet veather. For detailed vehicle access info and gate schedules visit www.chico.ca.us (Bidwell Park on drop-down menu) or call

Be sure to have everything you need to stay safe nd comfortable including water, sun protection and appropriate clothes & shoes. Watch for azards! You may also encounter poison oak, ticks, rattlesnakes, large wildlife, swift water, or steep drop-offs. Avoid danger by staying on designated trails and explore with a friend.

Prohibited in Bidwell Park:

• All Smoking & Vaping

Campfires and BBQs outside of designated

• Excessive Noise

Lower Park: Dogs may be off leash from 5:30 AM until 8:30 AM

and must remain under voice control. At all other times, dogs must be on leash. Upper Park: Dogs may be off leash on the north side of Upper

Park Road and must remain under voice control. Dogs must be on leash in all areas on and south of Upper Park Road. Dogs are prohibited from harassing or harming wildlife or

Swimming Areas: Dogs are not allowed in Sycamore Pool, on the pool deck, or the surrounding grass area in Lower Park. Dogs are also not allowed in any other named swimming hole in Bidwell Park.

ishing is subject to current CA Fish & Wildlife Code. Fishing is prohibited from any bridge over Big Chico Creek or the bank of any swimming pool or named swimming area in Bidwell Park.

Horseshoe Lake is catch & release for ages 14 and over. Under 14 is catch and keep. Persons over 14 must have a valid fishing
